Invacare's fully sealed (FS) pressure redistributing mattress meets the needs of challenging environments, and has been designed for the following demanding settings:

- Mental Health
- Secure Units
- Dementia Care;

In these areas, considerations such as entrapment, ligature risk and deliberate equipment damage are all potentially serious issues.

Mattresses designed to reduce the risk of destroying and accessing internal components are often a key requirement.

Made from a highly resistant polyurethane coating the Fully Sealed mattress cover is extremely resistant to intentional damage.

The FS mattress is suitable for those at **High Risk/Very High risk** of developing pressure ulcers.

The Invacare Softform Premier Spinal is a high specification mattress designed for those with spinal conditions or injury. It is suitable for those considered at 'Very High Risk' of developing pressure ulcers. It provides a choice of 2 support surfaces in one mattress, to cover a wide range of comfort and spinal alignment requirements. Following a spinal injury, a firm support surface may be necessary to assist in immobilising the spine (the blue 'firm' side). The unique dual laver design provides the option of a softer, comfort foam (the orange 'comfort' side), offering greater pressure redistribution, which may be more appropriate at a later stage in the rehabilitation process.

> The Invacare Propad Renal Overlay has been developed in conjunction with clinicians to provide additional comfort, effective pressure redistribution and security for patients undergoing dialysis treatment. It can be used with a wide range of dialysis chairs, for vulnerable patients who are at 'high risk' of developing pressure ulcers.

The foam core has independent. geometrically-cut surface cells which significantly reduce shear and friction. whilst increasing the overall support surface area, thereby reducing peak pressure. The Renal Overlay has larger, more supportive cells at the centre and smaller cells at the ends of the foam core for improved weight distribution conforming to the shape and form of the body.



Hot topics in Pressure Area Care - what's in the news

Pressure Ulcers and Pressure Injury terminology

In 2016 The National Pressure Ulcer Advisory Panel (NPUAP) redefined the definition of pressure injuries during the NPUAP 2016 Staging Consensus Conference, Rosemont (Chicago), IL. The definition of a "Pressure Injury" was given as follows:

A pressure injury is localized damage to the skin and underlying soft tissue usually over a bony prominence or related to a medical or other device. The injury can present as intact skin or an open ulcer and may be painful. The injury occurs as a result of intense and/or prolonged pressure or pressure in combination with shear. The tolerance of soft tissue for pressure and shear may also be affected by microclimate, nutrition, perfusion, comorbidities and condition of the soft tissue

So will the European Pressure Ulcer Advisory Panel (EPUAP) also make this change to the terminology of pressure ulcers? It's in discussion and @Tpressurecare are keeping a close eye on for any developments...

The Big Challenge

Think Pressure Care under took a large scale questionnaire in 2016 to ask Tissue Viability Nurses "What was their biggest Challenge?"

The overall theme of the answers we received was lack of access to clear and concise education on products and latest guidance, also keeping up with industry changes without having information overload.
